Engagement with Provincial Government

- Objectives of the Road-Show were to:
 - Inform provincial government on the national electricity grid infrastructure strategic environmental assessment process;
 - Consult on the location of preliminary corridors;
 - Consult on environmental and engineering sensitivities identified within the corridors
 - Consult on applicable information available at a provincial level









- Western Cape
 - Conceptual and practical implications of the Site Specific Protocol needs clarification;
 - Clarification on what is a 'No Go' area;
 - Clarification on pooling of constraints required;
 - Need to include results of agriculture land use study.

Eastern Cape

- Concerns that SEA will replace EIA and need for specialist assessment
- How will suitable engagement with tribal authorities will be achieved?;
- Need to make use of existing district and local municipalities forums/platforms
- Existing game farms and future expansion plans
- Existing commercial forestry and future expansion plans
- Classification of agricultural land needs to be done in consultation with DAFF









North West

- Maximise socio economic benefit
- Dominance of mining activity;
- Rural development and electrification focussed
- Clarification on legal context behind adoption of SEA recommendations

• Limpopo

- Strong reservations around the transmission line corridor that extends to the east of the escarpment- conflict with conservation, tourism and local communities;
- How will suitable engagement with tribal authorities will be achieved?.









Kwa-Zulu Natal

- Concern around the lack of an integrative approach between SIPs
- Wall to Wall assessment should be undertaken
- Clarification on what is a 'No Go' area
- Provide rationale and document underlying assumptions for each criterion from a legal/scientific perspective
- Consideration of National Protected Areas Expansion Strategy

Northern Cape

- Maximise socio-economic benefits
- HoD Forum must be consulted prior to Provincial Exco
- Consultation with farmers/ farming associations
- Consideration of National Protected Areas Expansion Strategy









Free State

- Existing game farms and future expansion plans
- HoD Forum must be consulted prior to Provincial Exco

Mpumalanga

– Bird and Bat data assumes sedentary existence. How will we cater for movement?









Cross Cutting Themes

- NPAES focus areas
- Socio economic component is crucial, particularly in poorer provinces
- Well planned and executed local government consultation process is necessary,
